Periodicity Comments

- MD:** Assess risk factors for anemia in females 13 yr and older.
- Clinical Staff/MD:** Check lipid panel once age 9-11.
- Clinical Staff/MD:** Check vision for all sports physicals.
- MD:** STI testing: All patients 15 or older check GC/C and HIV (consider RPR). Repeat testing based on risk factors.
- MD:** HPV vaccine change, only 2 separated by at least 6 month ages 9-14 yr
- MD:** Adolescent screen should include CRAFFT & Depression screening.

Immunization Misc.

Flu*: 2 vaccines separated by at least 1 month first year, then give annually
